##### Improving Outcomes for Individuals with Serious Mental Illness and Diabetes

This project tests a model for improving illness self-management among persons who have both serious mental illness and diabetes and will be performed within a primary care setting at a safety net hospital system. The information gained from the randomized trial will be supplemented with reports from participants about their experiences of trying to improve illness self-management. Improvements in self-management should result in a reduction of psychiatric symptoms and improvements in functioning and physical health.

##### An Open-Source Public Domain Health Risk Assessment for Use in Primary Care

Health risk appraisals (HRA) have the potential to improve individual and population health outcomes by providing patients with important information on how lifestyle behaviors affect health. We propose to re-engineer an existing HRA that will be a free-standing, open-source, public domain HRA engine based on the most up-to-date scientific data, and that will allow for easy scalability and interoperability with any number of other interfaces and systems, including websites and electronic medical record systems from different vendors.

##### Faculty Development for Primary Care

This grant will create a faculty development program to optimize faculty productivity and patient outcomes in a safety net health system. The faculty will be role models for the trainees encouraging careers in care of the underserved. The faculty development will focus on the challenges of primary care for the 21st century including health disparities, academic productivity in a safety net system, teaching skills, improving quality of care and cross discipline education in systems-based care.

##### Economic Benefit of Americorps in Reducing Hospital Readmissions

The broad objective of this study is to explore the effects of an AmeriCorps member-delivered coaching intervention designed to reduce hospital readmissions. Findings of positive effects could motivate further initiatives and research on the role that volunteer organizations could play to productively augment traditional medical providers.

##### Targeted Management Intervention for African-American Men with TIA or Stroke

2012-2014 NIH/NINR: 1R21NR013001 \$195,552 Co-Investigator, 10% effort

African-American (AA) men are disproportionately burdened by strokes and generally has sub-optimal post-stroke care. Few studies have focused on improving post-stroke care involvement



for AA men stroke survivors. This 2-phase project will refine an existing psychosocial intervention developed by these investigators, and then test the refined intervention in AA men with first time stroke or transient ischemic attack (TIA) vs. treatment as usual. The project has the potential to reverse the unacceptably high morbidity seen in AA men due to stroke.

#### Targeted Self-Management for Epilepsy and Serious Mental Illness

This project will refine and test a Targeted Self-Management Intervention for individuals with epilepsy and serious mental illness based on input from key stakeholders (individuals and family members of individuals with E-SMI, clinical providers and community health workers). This pilot trial will examine feasibility, acceptability and preliminary efficacy.

#### Health Effects of Racial Segregation on Aging Adults

This study used longitudinal data from the Health and Retirement Study to explore potential causal pathways between racial segregation and health status. Using multi-level modeling, spatial and aspatial measures of segregation at the census tract level were modeled along with economic, physical, social and health infrastructure constructs at the community level and demographic, socioeconomic, and health behaviors at the individual level.
